If you are a dog owner, or know someone who owns a dog, please inform them it is a violation within The Pine's and Thurston County to let dog (s) run loose outside unattended. There is a county wide leash law which applies to the Pine's. If your dog (s) is an outside dog and you let it out to relieve itself, please keep in confined in your own yard.

There are many residents who like to go for walks and do not appreciate fending off dogs. Nor do they like to clean up "presents" left behind by wandering dogs. Please Consider your neighbors. Thank you for being a considerate pet owner.

94.1A.016 <u>What is considered uncontrolled weeds, vegetation and dry grass?</u> The following is, but not limited to, a list of what is considered uncontrolled weeds, vegetation and dry grass:

- (1) Any hazardous or uncultivated plant growing in profusion so as to crowd out desired plant growth or otherwise disfigure a lawn; or
- (2) Any vegetation growth, including but not limited to, weeds, grasses, bushes, hedges and trees or tree branches which obstructs the vision of people in vehicles or on right-of-ways so as to interfere with the safe, full and free use of such street or right-of-way; or
- (3) Any accumulation of weeds, brambles, berry vines, or other uncultivated vegetation that exceeds the average height of fifteen (15) inches, which is overgrowing or adjacent to any legally stored vehicle, motor home, travel trailer, utility trailer, semitrailer, pickup truck, camper or canopy, watercraft, fence or fence line, garbage cans, burn barrel, tree stump, firewood stack, decorative rock or existing boulders, fuel tanks, children's playground equipment, flower beds, or utility pole; or
- (4) Grass that is not maintained and over fifteen (15) inches tall that is dry and brown in color and easily combustible.

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With daylight increasing a little each day we still need to pay attention as we are out and about - **PLEASE** be mindful of vehicle traffic!! For your safety, please walk along the edge of the roads or in the easement against oncoming traffic.

Carry a flashlight, head lamp or wear bright colored clothes so you can be seen easier during the twilight and evening hours.

Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.



When walking or riding a bike please wear bright clothing or reflective tape and/or carry a flashlight. Remember it is hard for cars to see you at night if you are wearing dark colored clothing.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.

1. Discussion regarding reflective markers for our speed bumps. - Connie

Connie did a test of the reflective piece on her street and it has worked nicely. Cost for all of the reflectors for our speed bumps would be around 500\$ from where she bought them (includes the mounding tape pads); based on 3 markers per side of each speed bump. Per Cory we would need to counter sink them so they don't get scraped up when we plow. Connie disagrees – showed us video of installation – requested for her to send out the video link. Idea is to have cory show to maintenance with the item and try them on the main road. Dayna, Sherry, and Crystal agree with the idea – Jennifer thinks we should go through with the grinding recommended by Cory.

2. Discussion regarding the completion of the basketball court.- Connie

Connie showed us website for American Super Sports to show the cost being 1500-3200 per back board. Focus is one (SKU: PR52) 60x42 Steel Backboard, standard extension, pole padding only for \$2,117. We discussed whether this was already approved – need to check with Charity on this. Also, requested about striping to find out costs and companies to complete. 3. Upcoming elections in June, marketing options. - Crystal

Connie and Sherry are up for vote this year. Connie wants to not run and instead start a finance committee. Ideas for marketing the open seats: facebook, signs, newsletters, water bill, special mailer to advertise – big thing is putting out earlier. Crystal to email out a mock post to start with the advertising.

4. Discussion of proposal by CC Window Solutions for replacement of office windows. Connie

Proposal will expire at end of March based on the dates written in the contract. Connie is concerned about making sure we pick a contractor that will get the correct permits for the contracting work being done. Connie is also concerned about us getting this approved in time.
