

# Clever Cake Mix Crinkle Cookies From: All Recipes

# HANDS-ON 10 MIN TOTAL 45 MIN MAKES 4 DOZEN

- 1 (15.25 to 16.5 oz.) box cake mix
- 6 Tbsp. melted butter or canola oil
- 2 Large eggs
- 1/2 cup powered sugar
- 1. Position rack in center of oven and preheat to 375 F. Stir together cake mix, melted butter, and eggs in a large bowl.
- 2. Shape dough into 1-inch balls; roll in powered sugar to coat. set balls about 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets.
- 3. Bake, 1 pan at a time, just until edges are firm and cracks appear slightly moist, 9 to 11 minutes. Cool on pans 3 mins; transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. (Cookies can be stored in an airtight container up to 3 days or frozen up to 3 months.)

# Lemon Crinkles

Use a lemon cake mix, and if desired, add 1 tsp. grated lemon zest to the dough.

# **Chocolate Crinkles**

Use chocolate cake mix

# **Snickerdoodles**

Use a vanilla cake mix and roll dough in a mixture of 1/4 cup sugar and 1 tsp. cinnamon instead of powdered sugar before baking.


# **Dumpster Days**



# Fend off fleas in winter

Cold temperatures mean a higher risk of fleas indoors— the critters don't hibernate, so they seek out warm places like your carpet. Banish them with salt, which acts as a dehydrating agent to kill the pests.


TO DO: Sprinkle finely ground salt on carpets; let sit for an hour. Vacuum it up, then empty the container in the outside garbage. Repeat every two days for a week to ensure you've killed every egg.







Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.




