

Clubs & Organizations: Weekly meetings-\$100 per month plus refundable cleaning deposit of \$150. No more than one two hour meetings per week.

Monthly Meetings: \$35 per month plus refundable cleaning deposit of \$150. No more than one two hour meetings per month.

Additional refundable deposit of \$100 for any event having alcohol. As long as there is no alcohol related damage the deposit will be refunded. Banquet permit is required at time of walk through.


### **Dumpster Days**

Provide warm beds for naps.



### TRASH BURNING IS ILLEGAL!

Where burning is allowed, only natural vegetation (leaves, brush, etc..) may be burned. State law prohibits the burning of the following materials, including, but not limited to, paper or newspaper (except to start a fire), cardboard, household garbage, treated, painted or stained wood, plywood, construction debris, paints, tires and other rubber products, plastics, asphalt and building materials, chemicals, petroleum products, metal, and dead animals.

Smoke, odor or ash which goes beyond your property and impacts a neighbor is illegal. Violations of outdoor burning laws may result in fines up to \$14,915 per violation per day.


### 94.1.020 Who are the responsible persons?

All members are responsible for their own behavior, the behavior of their family members, people living with them, their tenants and the guests of any of these. The Pines is intended to be a peaceful residential community and if members cannot prevent their family, guests or tenants from committing prohibited activities, they should consider not inviting such guest, alternate living arrangements, county law enforcement and mental health authorities or other possible courses of action and resources.

The Pines has jurisdiction over all members of the association. The member is the owner of the "real" property as recorded in the county records.

Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights and rear taillights to make sure that they are in working condition.

# PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig

Winter is here- you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.




