



FLOOD BULLETIN

Two primary causes of groundwater flooding include:

Consecutive monthly rainfall of more than 10 Inches per month, and Extended rainfall during the course of a year.

Both causes keep groundwater levels elevated for long periods of timeleading to damaged structures and contaminated wells.

It can take as long as five years for groundwater to move through underlying soils and into the local rivers and lakes. This means flooding can be delayed or extended over a longer period of time.

The greatest influence on how much rains received in Thurston County comes from Pacific weather patterns. Phenomena such as El Nino, La Nina, atmospheric rivers and the Pacific Decadal Oscillation all influence the amount of rain we receive. The effect of these phenomena on rainfall has begun to change, making it harder for the National Weather Service to create long-term predictions.

To better understand our local rainfall events, global weather patterns, and effects on our groundwater levels, Thurston County maintains a monitoring network that tracks precipitation and groundwater levels over time. Go to water.thurstonstormwater.org to explore local water and weather trends. As of August 2019, groundwater levels are significantly below average throughout the county.

The highest risk of groundwater flooding is in the Salmon Creek Basin located near the Olympia Regional Airport. Other high-risk locations include the area east of Lacey and outside of Yelm.


Dumpster Days







94.1.075 What property development activities are prohibited in The Pines? No person, owner, tenant, contractor, or developer within the legal boundaries of Nisqually Pines Community Club who owns or is developing or changing the landscaping or property within The Pines shall not::

(1)General

(a) Have more than one single family dwelling on each legally platted lot; 1st offence: \$1,000 2nd offence: \$2,500 3rd offence: \$5,000 4th offence: \$1,000

Paragraph (3) Section C-Burning any garbage or toxic items: 1st offence: \$250 2nd offence: \$300 3rd offence: \$500 4th offence: \$1,000

Please remember that household furniture and garbage are not to be burned. It's a warning letter and a fine the next time. Also you could get a large fine from ORCCA.


WAC 173-425, RCW 70.94, ORCAA Regulation 6: Rule 6.2

Burn only natural vegetation originating on the property where the burn occurs. Trash burning is illegal and may result in fines of up to \$14,915.

Do NOT use a burn barrel. Burn barrels and other burn containers are illegal under state law and their use may result in fines.






Carry a flashlight, head lamp or wear bright colored clothes so you can be seen easier during the twilight and evening hours.



Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.


