

Winter Safety Tips

Winter is here and we want to be sure you all are prepared for cold weather and emergencies so we thought this one was worth sharing again.

Make an Emergency Kit for Your Car < courtesy of FEMA>

In case you are stranded, keep a kit of emergency supplies in your car including:

- Jumper cables: might want to include flares or reflective triangle
- Flashlights: with extra batteries
- First Aid Kit: remember any necessary medications, baby formula and diapers if you have a small child
- Food: non-perishable food such as canned food, and protein rich foods like nuts and energy bars
- · Manual can opener
- Water: at least 1 gallon of water per person a day for at least 3 days
- · Basic toolkit: pliers, wrench, screwdriver
- Pet supplies: food and water
- Radio: battery or hand cranked
- Cat litter or sand: for better tire traction
- Shovel
- Ice Scraper
- Clothes: warm clothes, gloves, hat, sturdy boots, jacket and an extra change of clothes for the cold
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Charged cell phone and car charger

Ingredients

- 6 Tablespoons butter
- 2 Tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 11/2 teaspoons seasoned salt
- · 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
- 3 cups corn Chex
- 3 cups rice Chex
- 3 cups wheat Chex
- 1 cup peanuts
- 2 cups pretzels
- 2 cups cheese crackers

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 250 F
- 2. Place butter in the bottom of a large roasting pan. Put in oven until butter is melted
- 3. Stir Worcestershire, seasoned salt, garlic and onion powders.
- 4. Stir in cereal, peanuts, pretzels and cheese crackers.
- 5. Bake for an hour, stirring every 15 minutes.
- 6. Spread baked Chex mix out over wax paper and allow to cool completely before placing in an airtight container to store.


Dumpster Days







State law prohibits the burning of the following materials, including, but not limited to, paper or newspaper (except to start a fire), cardboard, household garbage, treated, painted or stained wood, plywood, construction debris, paints, tires and other rubber products, plastics, asphalt and building materials, chemicals, petroleum products, metal and dead animals. Smoke, odor or ash which goes beyond your property and impacts neighbors is illegal.

Violations of outdoor burning laws may result in fines up to \$14,915 per violation per day!

I am still seeing hoses connected to your outside hose bibs. Please disconnected them and winterize those hose bibs, if they freeze and bust we cannot give you credit on your water bill because you didn't winterize.

During the cold weather keep your animals water bowls unthawed and their house stuffed with straw.

For flea problems mix cedar chips with the straw, you can get a bag at any farm supply store.

They are not wild animals they depend on you to take care of them.

Keep an eye on the usage line on your water bills, we only check 2000 or more cubic feet, so if you are a small user and went up to 1500 cubic feet we may not catch it. If you think you may have a leak just call and we will come check your meter.





Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig



Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.



Treasurers Report: Mike, going over at the next meeting in more detail. Motion to pass September's report. M/S/C.

Unfinished Business: Speed bump on Holly near Aspen, returning to this matter at next months meetings.

New Business: Truck for maintenance was purchased recently. The former maintenance truck is being passed down to our Water Department and Board Members will discuss what to do with the now former water department truck at the next Study Session. Details on new truck- 2020 Ford Super duty 4-wheel drive, crew cab XLT, 6.7L with 59,200 Miles.

\$42,000 Purchase price, paid \$46,045.41 total.

Department Check-in's:

Office- Cory not here to discuss, but so far all is believed to be going well.

Maintenance- Purchased new truck, detailed above.

Water/River Park- No major updates, want to circle back to the piles of woodchips/curb appeal at next meeting.

Pool- Plaster has been removed from the pool. Pressure test was unable to determine the location of the leak. The core test determined that the pool is still sound. We are currently waiting for a new update for further diagnosis of the leak.

Clubhouse- No new updates currently. Will follow up on any bids or estimates needing collected for moving forward on this project.

Adjudication- A couple of people showed up, the committee did make some decisions at this last meeting. Subject residents will be notified of said decisions.

Member/Community Comments:

- Barbed wire fence on Wilkensen Rd SE; community member believes that the fence looks unattractive for our community and wants it to come down. Members have previously discussed this fence and have heard from some community residents surrounding the fence, and their belief is that it should remain up for security purposes and feeling safer where they reside. Will revisit this at the upcoming Study Session for further discussion.
- Street lighting throughout the Nisqually Pines Community; needs to be assessed and discussed for the safety of our community and most importantly the youth taking busses before and after the sun is out. Discuss a solution for streetlights throughout the Pines.
- Provide copies of the USDA Loan for members of the community for the next meeting. Member requests up to date balance reflecting recent large payment made.
- A residence at the very end of Holly Street next to the River Park, has a total of 7 very bright lights that don't all directly point into their property.
