



Due to the Covid-19 virus the pool is closed until further notice. Thurston County will notify me as to when I can reopen the pool.








Do to social distancing the community yard sale that was planned for June 6th & 7th might have to be rescheduled do to the Governor's mandate.







Hours are 8am to 9:00pm approximately



Please remember that kids are outside playing and enjoying their time off.





Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights and rear taillights to make sure that they are in working condition.

As summer approaches, you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.






