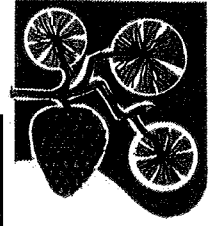

Please be courteous to your neighbors. If you do fireworks and make a mess it is your responsibility to clean it up. Don't expect the maintenance men to do it for you.

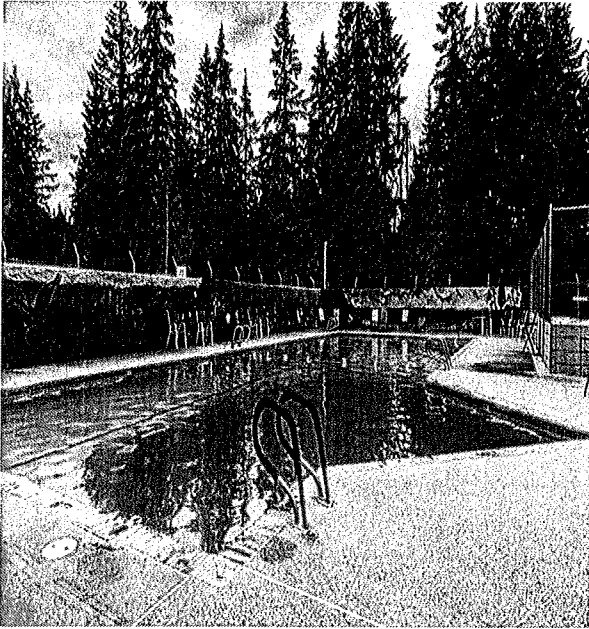

# Key Lime Bars

Makes: 12 servings  
Delish Test Kitchen

## Ingredients

### Crust

Cooking Spray  
9 graham crackers, crushed  
6 Tbsp. butter, melted  
1/4 cup granulated sugar

### Lime Filling & Assembly

4oz cream cheese, room temperature  
4 large egg yolks  
1 (14oz) can sweetened condensed milk  
1/2 cup fresh lime juice  
Pinch of salt  
1 cup cool whip  
1 lime, zested  
3 key limes or 2 regular limes, cut into round, halved (or 2 regular limes)

## Directions

**Step 1:** Arrange a rack in center of oven; preheat to 350. Grease an 8X\* pan with cooking spray.

**Step 2:** In medium bowl, mix graham crackers, butter, and sugar until combined. Firmly press into bottom of prepared pan.

### Lime Filling & Assembly

**Step 1:** In a large bowl, using a handheld mixer on medium-high speed. Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add egg yolks, condensed milk, lime juice, and salt and beat until combined. Pour into crust.

**Step 2:** Bake bar until filling is completely set, 15-20 minutes. Refrigerate until cold, at least 2 hours and up to overnight.

**Step 3:** Cut into squares. Top with a dollop of cool whip and key lime rounds. Sprinkle with lime zest.

## Dumpster Days

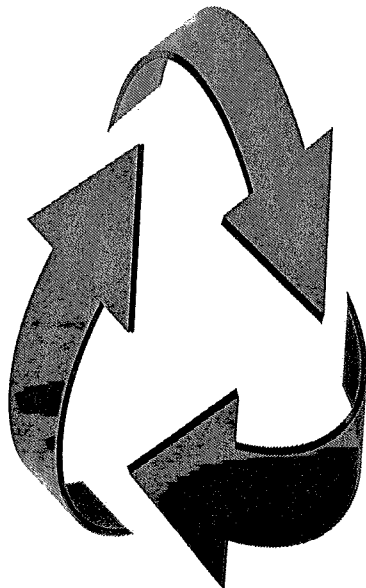

Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.

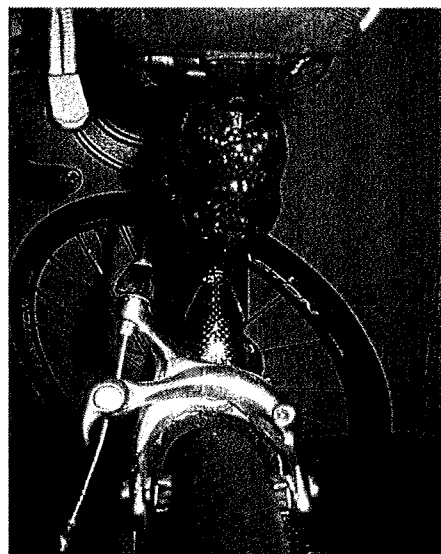


Car Owners— Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.



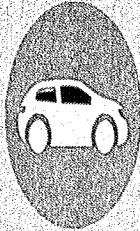

# Summer Heat Safety Tips!



A car can overheat **even** when the window has been left cracked an inch or two. Many states and local governments have laws that prohibit leaving an animal unattended in a vehicle under dangerous conditions.

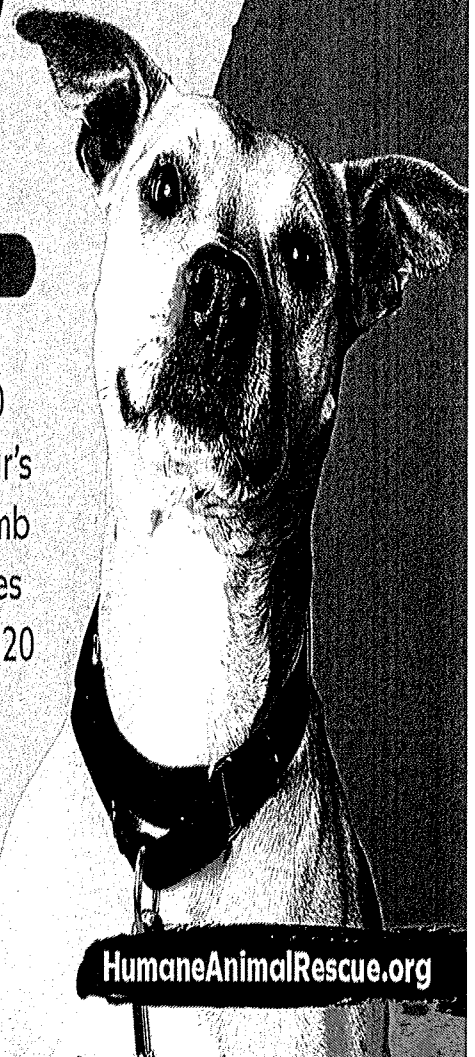
Young, overweight or elderly animals, or those with short muzzles or thick or dark-colored coats are **most at risk** for overheating.



Even if the temperature outside is only 70 degrees, the inside of your car may be as much as 20 degrees hotter!

On an 85 degree day, it only takes ten minutes for the inside of your car to reach 102 degrees.

Within just 30 minutes, the car's interior can climb from 85 degrees to a scorching 120 degrees!



If you see an animal trapped in a car on a hot day, try to locate the owner or call 911! Stay by the car until assistance arrives.

### Call 811 Before You Dig

Spring has arrived and you may still have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.
