Rhubarb Custard Bars

Prep:25min. Bake: 50 min.+ Chilling

Makes 3 dozen

Ingredients:

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/4 cup sugar

1 cup cold butter

Filling:

2 cups sugar

7 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 cup heavy whipping cream

3 large eggs, beaten

5 cups finely chopped fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed and drained

Topping:

6 ounces cream cheese, softened

1/2 cups sugar

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract


1 cup heavy whipping cream, whipped

Directions;

- 1) In a bowl, combine the flour and sugar; cut in butter until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Press into a greased 13X9 inch baking pan. Bake at 350 for 10 minutes.
- 2) Meanwhile, for filling, combine sugar and flour in a bowl. Whisk in cream and eggs. Stir in the rhubarb. Pour over crust. Bake at 350 until custard is set, 40-45 min. Cool.
- 3) For topping, beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla until smooth; fold in whipped cream. Spread over top. Cover and refrigerate until firm enough to cut, about 1 hour. Cut into bars. Store in refrigerator.


Dumpster Days



Please renew your burn permit. You can go online at www.orcaa.org

If you choose to burn your yard waste and you live in an area where it is legal to do so, please follow these guidelines:

Check Permit requirements for your area. For instance, all fires within Thurston County require permits. Do Not use a burn barrel. Burn barrels and other burn containers are illegal under state law and there use may result in fines.

Burn only natural vegetation from your own property. Trash burning is illegal and may result in fines of up to \$14,915 dollars.

Check the weather prior to starting your burn. Don't burn during air stagnation events nor in windy conditions.

Fires must be attended at all times and must be completely extinguished.

Do not create a nuisance. You are responsible for your fire. Creating smoke, odor and ash that unreasonable impacts neighboring properties is illegal.


Five Summer Dangers for Pets

Insecticides, insect repellents, sunscreen, citronella products and glow sticks are toxic, so keep them away from your pet.

Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig

Spring has sprung and you may still have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.


The trail from Heather to the River Park is "<u>Use at your own risk"</u> due to the storm damage and erosion.






