

The greenbelts are to remain in there natural state. They are a buffer between neighbors and clubhouse area to help keep the noise level down.


Our maintenance men have been cleaning up the greenbelts and we have found things that are not to be in there.





Pumpkin Peanut Butter Dog Treats

2 1/2 cups of oat flour
1/2 cup unsweetened applesauce
3/4 cup of pumpkin puree
3 tbsp peanut butter

Preheat oven to 350°. Combine ingredients well. Roll out 1/2 inch thick and cut individual biscuits with cookie cutter.

Lay out on greased cookie sheet and bake for 40 minutes or until crunchy. Allow to cool completely before letting your pup enjoy! Keep for up to one week in a sealed container.




ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:



General Outdoor Burning Rules

Check Permit Requirement for your area. For instance, all fires within Thurston County require permits.

Do NOT use a burn barrel. Burn barrels and other burn containers are illegal under the state law and their use may result in fines.


Burn only natural vegetation from your own property. Trash burning is illegal and may result in fines up to \$14,915 dollars.

Check the weather prior to starting your burn. Don't burn during air stagnation events nor in windy conditions.

Fires must be attended at all times and must be completely extinguished.

Do NOT create a nuisance. Your responsible for your fire. Creating smoke, odor, and ash that unreasonably impacts neighbors properties is illegal.

Hot tubs, Pools, Driplines need



This is a vacuum breaker for the hose bib (spigot outside) protects your house from backsiphinage. Anything you threw your hose in to fill has the potential to contaminate your family and the water system. **Protection is the key.**

All outside hose bibs must have a vacuum breaker on them.





Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig

As winter/spring approaches, you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.


PARK TRAIL


