Homemade Bird Suet

1/2 cup bacon fat
1/2 cup peanut butter
1 cup cornmeal
1 cup rolled oats
1/2 cup flour
1 cup of bird seed



- 1. Melt peanut butter and bacon fat in the microwave for a minute or so, mix well
- 2. Mix in remaining ingredients and stir well
- 3. Spoon into paper cups and place in the freezer or refrigerator
- 4. Once it's cooled completely tear the cup away from the suet, plash in mesh bag or suet holder
- 5. Tie twine around the opening end secure it enough to hang from a tree or shepherds hook





Humming Bird Food Refined White Sugar Water

Directions for making safe hummingbird food:

- 1) Mix 1 part sugar with 4 parts water (example 1 cup of sugar with 4 cups of water) until sugar is dissolved
- 2) Do NOT add red dye
- 3) Fill your clean hummingbird feeders with the sugar water and place outside
- 4) Extra sugar water can be stored in the refrigerator
- 5) Change feeders every other day and thoroughly clean them each time to prevent harmful mold growth

Additional refundable deposit of \$100 for any event having alcohol. As long as there is no alcohol related damage the deposit will be refunded. Banquet permit is required at time of walk through.


Dumpster Days

Dogs are to be on leashes at all times when outside their fenced yards. This includes all park areas which are river park, little lake park, clubhouse park area, playground by the office and the office area.





Where burning is allowed, only natural vegetation (leaves, brush, etc.) may be burned. State law prohibits the burning of the following materials including, but limited to, paper or newspaper (except to start a fire), cardboard, household garbage, treated, painted or stained wood, plywood, construction debris, paints, tires and other rubber products, plastics, asphalt and building materials, chemicals, petroleum products, metal and dead animals.

Smoke, odor or ash which goes beyond your property and impacts a neighbor is illegal. Violations of outdoor burning laws may result in fines up to \$14,915 per violation per day.



Chocolate

Easter is typically the APCC's top day for chocolate intoxication calls, topping Christmas, Valentine's Day and even Halloween! Why? Pets find Easter candy hidden around the house or the yard, or get into unattended Easter baskets

True lilles and day lilles are a concern for acute kidney failure in cats. All homes with cats should be very careful with Easter lilles. We would discourage them from even entering houses with cats, but if they must be there, make sure cats can't access any part of the plant.

Table Food

Onlons, garilc, mecadamia nuta, grapes, and raisins are common toxic foods that pets ingest.



5 Herbicides

Make sure herbicides are kept where pets can't chew or puncture the bottle and that application is dry before letting the pets outside.





Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig

Winter has arrived and you may still have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.






