ULTIMATE MAC & CHEESE

Two kinds of cheese, plenty of bacon and fresh herbs and spices make this creamy side dish one of a kind.

Makes 8-10 servings Recipe from Comfort Classics

1/2 cup unsalted butter

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

2/3 cup minced yellow onion

4 cups whole milk

1 pound thick-cut bacon, cooked and crumbled, divided

4 1/2 cups shredded Colby-Jack cheese, divided

21/2 cups shredded smoked Gouda cheese, divided

3 tablespoons whole-grain mustard

3 tablespoons fresh thyme leaves, divided

11/2 teaspoons of kosher salt

1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/2 teaspoon ground red pepper

1/4 teaspoon grated fresh nutmeg

1 (16oz) package large shells pasta, cooked according to package directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- 2. In a 12-inch cast-iron skillet, melt butter over medium-high heat. Add flour, whisking to combine. Cook, whisking constantly, until mixture is light brown, about 15 min. Add onion; cook, stirring frequently, until tender, 3 to 4 minutes. Add milk, stirring constantly, until mixture begins to thicken, about 8 minutes.
- 3. Reserve 1/4 cup bacon for topping casserole. Add remaining bacon, 3 3/4 cups Colby-Jack, 1 3/4 cups Gouda, mustard, 2 tsps. Thyme, salt, black pepper, red pepper and nutmeg to milk mixture, stirring until cheeses are melted. Stir in cooked pasta; top with remaining 3/4 cup Colby-Jack and remaining 3/4 cup Gouda.
- 4. Bake until browned and bubbly, 20 to 25 minutes. Top with reserved 1/4 cup bacon and remaining 1 teaspoon thyme.




Dumpster Days



Please renew your burn permit. You can go online at www.orcaa.org

If you choose to burn your yard waste, and you live in an area where it is legal to do so, please follow these guidelines:

Check Permit requirements for your area. For instance, all fires within Thurston County require permits. Do NOT use a burn barrel. Burn barrels and other burn containers are illegal under state law and there use may result in fines.

Burn only natural vegetation from your own property. Trash burning is illegal and may result in fines of up to \$14,915 dollars.

Check the weather prior to starting your burn. Don't burn during air stagnation events nor in windy conditions. Fires must be attended at all times and must be completely extinguished.

Do not create a nuisance. You are responsible for your fire. Creating smoke, odor and ash that unreasonable impacts neighboring properties is illegal.



94.1A.018 What will happen if uncontrolled weeds, vegetation and dry grass are not maintained and become a fire hazard? During the summer months when it is hot and dry and the fire danger is high, grass and vegetation that is not maintained and over fifteen (15) inches tall and is dry and brown in color and easily combustible will not be permitted. The following will occur;

- (1)Owners of property with such grass and vegetation will be sent a certified letter advising of the grass and immediate fire hazard.
- (2) They will be advised that the grass must be cut and removed within ten (10) days of the date of the letter.
- (3) They will be given a list of names of persons who will cut and remove grass for a reasonable fee.
- (4) If the property is occupied and the owner does not comply, they will automatically be fined and it will be added to their account.
- (5) If the property is vacant the Pines will hire a contractor to cut and remove the grass or vegetation, all costs will be assessed against the property owner. This includes any legal fees or costs associated with having law enforcement (Thurston County Sheriff), if necessary, at the time of removal.




Carry a flashlight, head lamp or wear bright colored clothes so you can be seen easier during the twilight and evening hours.



Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

Spring has arrived and you may still have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.


