




- Raw poultry

- Chocolate


OK TO SHARE IN MODERATION:


Keep paws off snack bowls

This time of year, you like to leave a few treat in bowls for guests who stop by, but your furry pal keeps nosing around the bowl and you're worried she/he will eat something and get sick. To keep her out of the dish, animal trainers suggest startling your pet with a noisemaker, which will discourage bad behavior. To make your own, fill a toilet paper tube with uncooked rice or beans and tape aluminum foil over each end. The next time your pal goes in for a sniff, shake the tube and the sound will scare her/him off. Repeat this a few times and she/he will learn to associate the racket with the bowl and stay out of your goodies.



Hours are 8am to 7:30pm approximately





Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights and rear taillights to make sure that they are in working condition.

As fall/winter approaches, you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.







6:30 Open Meeting: Please silence your phones:

Roll call of board members: Tony Swy, Connie Ihringer, Claudia Privette, Sherry Odell, Absent: Madelon Barton, Cory Parsons, Dayna Brown.

Please note: this was a tough Minutes to write, people were not always using the mic, sometimes the microphone was hard to hear.

Special Guest Thurston County Sheriff: Dave Clariage head of the detail for the Pines

4 hour details: Community completes paperwork for the sheriff office to enforce the rules.

Patrol car sitting, monitoring comings and goings. Sit by gate and run plates and watch people come and go. We can stop if certain traffic violations occur.

Trespassers, burglaries, we can increase patrols, or move the times around to accommodate the budget for high theft time.

River Park Concerns: floaters begin in McKenna- unsafe to go past the Pines- hypothermia, Ft. Lewis, unsafe.

Sheriff check on homes if Pines homeowners request. Its encouraged to complete a form that you are going to be gone so that the deputies can check on your home. (forms are at the front office)

Smart phone: go on the app for Thurston County Sheriff App, Crime lab

Answered questions regarding the Contract and budget.

No Negotiations: Deputy's are paid over-time, up to \$111.60 an hour, that is for a top person-with degree etc.. not typical entry level deputy. The per hour wage is set by the county, includes L&I, state vehicle use etc, There is a Budget dollar amount for Nisqually Pines 7, 4-hour shifts per week-only stay at or under the budget amount. Sun -Saturday 7 days a week.

911is ALWAYS available to us for emergency police support.

The Board President signs the Yearly contract in January of every year. (this is considered into our Pines budget)


