Hours are 8am to 7:30pm approximately


Sat & Sun Hours: 11am-7:30pm

As summer approaches, you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, smart digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.





Since we have the Thurston County Sheriff in The Pines we have seen less criminal activity.





Nisqually Pines November Newsletter

Reliable transportation can be a barrier for Nisqually Pines residents of all ages, especially as we head towards the end of daylight savings and winter weather! We don't have subways or overhead rails that stop outside the park, and Big Bertha is not currently tunneling under Yelm Ave. So, if the time has come to either cut back on driving your car, or to stop driving altogether, or you don't like driving in wet weather, what should you do?

We do have Intercity Transit bus service that runs back and forth through Yelm to Walmart. If you've never ridden a bus before, you may be apprehensive or unsure of yourself. If that's the case, and you're not eligible for Dial-A-Lift, these programs might work for you.

Travel Training: Intercity Transit's two travel trainers, Curt Daniel and Diana Claus, will show you all the ropes – route numbers, where and when to catch the bus, how to get on and off if you have a disability, how to pay, where to sit, how to recognize your stop, is it safe, and so forth. They'll even go with you until you feel comfortable heading out on your own. For information, or to book an appointment, or to ask for a group discussion at the clubhouse, call Curt or Diana at 360-705-5879.

Bus Buddies: If you're already a bus-riding veteran, Intercity Transit (IT) has a partnership with Catholic Community Services (CCS) through the Bus Buddy program. A Bus Buddy is a volunteer expert bus rider, vetted by CCS and trained by IT, to assist anyone who needs a little extra help riding the bus. This free program provides bus-riding companionship to those who may be unsure about riding alone; may need help transferring up to Seattle for medical appointments; or just need someone to help them carry groceries home from Walmart or Safeway.

Right now we need a couple of Yelm residents to volunteer for this program, so it can be offered to everyone in Yelm. If you volunteer for six hours a month, your monthly bus pass will be free! For more information, call Scott Schoengarth at 360-688-8832.

Other Resources: If you need transportation assistance from your residence to the office to catch your Dial-A-Lift ride, or to get to the Intercity Transit's bus station at the Walmart, or maybe just to get to a medical appointment in Yelm, here are a couple of resources to call to see if they call help you:
