# Toxins

## to look out for this Fall



### Rodenticides



As the weather gets colder, mice and rats will be looking for warmer shelter... aka your house! This means bringing rat and mouse poisoning into the home. If ingested...

### Clinical Signs

weakness, lethargy, difficulty breathing, coughing blood, dehydration, inappetance, profuse vomiting, a distended stomach, tremors, seizures, kidney failures, and even death.



### Chocolate

Surprise, surprise! With Halloween right around the corner you're sure to have this delicious treat around your pets, which is especially dangerous to dogs. The toxic ingredients in chocolate are theobromine and caffeine. If ingested...

### Clinical Signs

agitation, panting, vomiting, diarrhea, racing heart rate, high blood pressure, abnormal heart rhythm, pancreatitis, tremors, seizures, and rarely death. FYI- the darker and more bitter = more dangerous!



### Compost/Mulch Piles

Before you start composting, make sure you have a fenced off, secured compost pile. If not only your pet, but wildlife as well, ingest the compost it can result in severe poisoning. If ingested...

### Clinical Signs

drooling, vomiting, inappetance, agitation, incoordination, tremors, and seizures.



### Mushrooms



Mushrooms are tricky because they are so hard to identify! There are a few types that can be deadly and the most dangerous one is the Amanita mushroom. Depending on the type, if ingested...

### Clinical Signs

drooling, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, walking drunk, tremoring, agitation, seizures, organ damage, or even death.



### Mothballs



Like rats and mice, moths sneak into the house as well! The classic smell of mothballs comes from the chemical naphthalene, which are much more toxic than paradichlorobenzene-containing ones. If ingested...

### Clinical Signs

drooling, vomiting, abdominal pain, lethargy, tremors, blood changes, and rarely even organ failure.

As summer approaches, you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.

**Treasurers Report** -Sherry O'Dell read Treasurers report. M/S/C

**Board application review:** Claudia Privette M/S/C Claudia was sworn into the board.

**Office- Cory Parsons report:** Good (conversation about taxes with member Connie, regarding non-profit status, paying penalties in January 2016 or 2017, Cory will ask our accountant for clarification.)

**Water/Maintenance- Cory Parsons report:** Well #7 - Water tests passed. Well is completed, although we are waiting on the state to give it final approval. Hoping to extend our Maintenance man retirement date. Mowing-and weed eating around the area, doing well.

**River Park- Mike Koon report:** Applications for River Park open- we have last years employees wanting to return. Mike will contact the previous employees.

**Pool/ Clubhouse** - Sherry O'Dell: Pool is not fixed yet, waiting on a part to get the pump in. April is returning as one of our pool employees. Applications were received for the second position. Clubhouse is being rented.
