



On August 27 Aqua Quip came out and put new drain covers in the pool.



Members: Full Day (7am-1am) \$75 rental \$150 refundable cleaning deposit= \$225

Two hours \$25 deposit plus \$75 refundable cleaning deposit Alcohol Deposit-\$100 if no damage is refundable

Members Sponsoring Non-Members:

Full Day (7am-1am) \$150 deposit \$150 refundable cleaning deposit Two hours \$35 plus \$100 refundable cleaning deposit (not more than one in a three month period)

Clubs & Organizations: Weekly meetings-\$100 per month plus refundable cleaning deposit of \$150. No more than one two hour meetings per week.

Monthly Meetings: \$35 per month plus refundable cleaning deposit of \$150. No more than one two hour meetings per month.

Additional refundable deposit of \$100 for any event having alcohol. As long as there is no alcohol related damage the deposit will be refunded. Banquet permit is required at time of walk through.






ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:




94.1.035 What domestic activities are prohibited in The Pines? No person within the legal boundaries of Nisqually Pines Community Club shall:






Carry a flashlight, head lamp or wear bright colored clothes so you can be seen easier during the twilight and evening hours.



Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights and rear taillights to make sure that they are in working condition.

PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig

Winter is here- you may have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.



Please silence all cell phones.

Roll call of board members: Tony Swy, Dayna Brown, Jennifer Celmer, Sherry O'Dell, Cory Parsons, Connie Ihringer. Crystal Detwiler was absent from this meeting. Rules/Civility reminder

- 1) Review of Draft Budget: prepared by Charity and JoAnn: Charity was present and brought notes and worksheets. She explained the two budgets she has been working on with our bookkeeper JoAnn. The board will vote at the open board meeting which budget we will use.
- 2) Long range Plan requests: We need dollar amounts for the office ready for Open Board: discussed the option to use the reserve study as an option for some of the dollar amounts.
- 3) Review of Assessment Changes for FY 2021-22: Revised following Zoom discussion (Connie) Connie presented this in a letter to the board.
- 4) Discussion: Use of Excess Funds in Reserve Account: \$204,000 (Connie) Discussed the idea of a retractable roof over the community pool with the extra funds. Further information will be needed regarding cost: heating the pool, Chlorine, employees. Connie requested to do a site visit and find out about county regulations. Pool Contact (Dayna) will ask Paulette our pool authority what we need to consider regarding additional pool expenses and regulations. Another option that was discussed was to use the funds to help pay for water hook up if lots that have previously not been buildable are changed to buildable by the county.
- 5) Discussion of what needs included for contractor bids: After the meeting, the board walked the Clubhouse and made suggestions for contractor bids.
- 6) Clubhouse prep for safety: fire safety and cooling center (Dayna) Tabled for a later study.
- 7) Discussion: hiring a Designer for the Clubhouse Project (Connie) discussion was held
- 8) Select Date for September Membership Meeting: Based on current Bylaws in effect (Connie) Saturday, August 21st possible date for Town meeting. August 25th for membership meeting.
- 9) Discussion: Identify "recurring meeting" ID and link for future membership use (Connie)
- 10) Discussion about basketball hoop at Thuja and Pepperidge Ln. (Sherry) Discussed moving the basketball hoop to a place in that area to make it more efficient.
