



LOOSE DOGS



The first offense is \$100, 2nd offense \$250, third offense \$500 and 4th offense \$1,000.

If you are a dog owner, or know someone who owns a dog, please inform them it is a violation within The Pine's and Thurston County to let dog (s) run loose outside unattended. There is a county wide leash law which applies to the Pine's. If your dog (s) is an inside dog and you let it out to relieve itself, please keep it confined to your own yard.

There are many residents who like to go for walks and do not appreciate fending off dogs. Nor do they like to clean up "presents" left behind by wandering dogs. Please consider your neighbors. Thank you for being a considerate pet owner.



94.1A.022-What is Refuse collections? The following is, but not limited to, a list of refuse collections that are not acceptable in the Pines;

- (1) Food garbage or leftover food articles or containers, bagged or not bagged left outdoors. Due to certain health concerns, owners will be sent a certified letter stating they have one week to dispose of or store garbage in proper garbage containers (not plastic bags). If the owner/renter fails to comply, a fine will be assessed. This fine may be appealed to the Adjudication Committee.
- (2) Broken household furniture and appliances left outdoors or stored on patios and decks.
- (3) Stacks of scrap lumber piled in a state of disarray* and uncovered.
- (4) Empty pallets stacked in disarray*.
- (5)Burned, partially burned or unburned tree limbs and stumps piled in a state of disarray*.
- (6)Outdoor yard tools left in yards or driveways until they are rusty and overgrown with grass and weeds.
- (7) Scrap iron or old rusted metal machinery or parts thereof.
- (8) Rock and/or dirt piles and stumps from uncompleted lot construction that cannot be defined as cultivated or as landscaping remaining 30 days after work stoppage. An extension, for good cause, may be requested at the office.
- (9) Neglected toys



The arrival of autumn brings a new set of challenges to pet owners, especially when the clocks go back, so here are some tips for keeping you and your pet safe and well as the nights draw in.

The change in seasons can bring on skin conditions, breathing issues, aching joints and allergies, make sure you are carefully monitoring your pets health, if you notice any unusual changes seek veterinary advice.





Slug pellets are poisonous to all pets so avoid using them in your flowerbeds and pots. If consumed by your pet it may cause twitching, fitting, diarrhoea, vomiting, excessive panting, uncoordinated walking, muscle tremors, hypothermia and many other symptoms. If your pet is showing any of these signs take your pet to the vet immediately.

milarly anti-freeze and screen-wash have the same dangerous life threatening effect on pets as slug pellets do, so if you're getting your car ready for winter remember how deadly they are to animals. What's worse is that there is a substance in anti-freeze and screen-wash that is highly palatable, so keep them away from your pets.

This time of year encourages rodents to seek warmer shelter so do not leave any rodenticides down in garages or shens where your pet could get at them as these can also be fat also pation


The **Firework season** seems to be getting longer each year and can be a story in time for all pets in different ways.

Problems with fleas and ticks both increase over the autumn period, with a peak when people start turning on their central heating. Make sure you use flea and tick control and check your pets coats often. If a tick is found make sure to use the correct tick removal kit.

Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.




