### Biscuits & Sausage Gravy Casserole

Makes 6 to 8 servings

1 teaspoon vegetable oil
1 pound ground sage breakfast sausage
3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
2 1/2 cups whole milk
1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage
1 1/4 teaspoons ground black pepper, divided
3/4 teaspoon kosher salt
1 (16.3-ounce) can of homestyle buttermilk biscuits, each biscuit quartered
1 tablespoon unsalted butter, melted
Garnish: chopped fresh sage

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Spray a 3 quart baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add sausage; cook until browned and crumbly, about 6 minutes. Add flour, cook 1 minute, stirring constantly. Gradually whisk in milk, sage, 1 teaspoon pepper and salt until smooth. Cook, whisking frequently, until mixture thickens, about 3 minutes. Spoon gravy into prepared pan.
- 3. Place biscuit quarters in an even layer on top of hot gravy. Brush with melted butter and sprinkle with remaining 1/4 teaspoon of pepper.
- 4. Bake until biscuits are golden brown and gravy is bubbly, 15 to 20 minutes. Let stand for 5 minutes before serving. Garnish with sage, if desired.

Summer has arrived and you may still have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.
